Literacy/Numeracy Groups

Our Literacy and Numeracy Groups begin on Monday as well as formal homework. Primary students will continue to do Reading Mastery this year. There are four principal areas taught which are decoding skills, comprehension skills, literary skills and study skills. Reading Mastery uses a widely acclaimed phonics method that features step-by-step instruction.

K/1/2, and some Primary students cementing their decoding skills, are using a strategic and explicit phonics program developed by Australian and international experts and supported by the Bathurst CEDB.

This program uses a <u>synthetic approach</u>, is <u>carefully sequenced</u>, is based on <u>explicit teaching</u> and has a <u>progression of skills</u> of increasing complexity.

Synthetic Phonics emphasises:

- The predictable relationships between the sounds in words and the letters which represent them
- Explicit blending of sounds to make words
- Much practice and review through explicit teaching
- The use of decodable books to practise blending skills that have already been learnt
- Explicit teaching of high frequency and irregular words (words often used in texts and words which cannot be decoded)

Reading fluency and comprehension skills will also be developed in a systematic, explicit way using the decodable books.







Our two students of the week are Ethan Brouff and Cody Wise. They have both taken on additional responsibilities this year and are displaying a positive approach in all that they do. They are caring and supportive to the younger students, both inside and outside the classroom. Both Ethan and Cody enjoy the Mathematics area of the curriculum and are always eager to complete tasks in this area. It is wonderful to see Ethan and Cody demonstrating their developing leadership skills.
